## Supervisor's Key Points Worksheet

Title:

Remove Your Gloves Immediately After Every Use

Ask your officers these questions to reinforce the training material:

1. Knowledge Question:

Why should you remove contaminated gloves after completing a task?

1. Answer

Contaminated gloves can spread germs to other surfaces or items if not removed and disposed of properly.

2. Application Question:

What steps should you take to properly remove and dispose of gloves after handling potentially contaminated items?

2. Answer

You should avoid touching the outside of the gloves to your skin, dispose of them properly, and wash your hands or use hand sanitizer until thorough washing is possible.

3. Evaluation Question:

Why is it important to manage gloves properly during tasks involving contamination, even though gloves are worn for protection?

3. Answer:

Gloves are not germ-proof, as bacteria can permeate them or linger on the outside, so improper management can spread germs to other surfaces, devices, or people, defeating th

Primary takeaways for your officers:

Wearing gloves is essential for personal protection during searches, especially when handling contaminated items. However, keeping gloves on while performing other tasks, like using equipment, can spread germs rather than contain them. Studies show gloves are not germ-proof, and bacteria can linger on the surface or permeate through them. Proper glove management—removing them carefully, avoiding contact with the outside, and washing hands afterward—prevents cross-contamination and protects everyone involved.
